# The Migration DRC at Sussex

- DFID funded Development Research Centre
- Began in 2003
- Aim: to promote new policy approaches that will help to maximize the potential benefits of migration for poor people, whilst minimizing its risks and costs.
- Partnership of eight institutions in five countries Bangladesh, Ghana, Albania, Egypt and the UK
- In Ghana, partnership with ISSER and RIPS



## Migration DRC Activities

- Remit is broad including carrying out research and promoting initiatives,
- Plus training, policy influencing and capacity building activities

### Core ideas

- Migration is an integral part of the everyday life of many poor people.
- Some forms of migration typify the poor more than others.
- Migrants need to be consulted and involved in the research process.

# DRC work on Child Migration

- Shared interest in children migrating without their parents or guardians
- contentious and under-researched but significant contemporary migration flow, especially in poor families.

#### Understudied because

- Research in childhood/children assumes are sedentary
- Research on migration assumes migrants are adults
- Separate projects in Bangladesh India Ghana (4), Burkina Faso with shared perspectives
