You should be able to demonstrate recent and prior experience teaching, ideally at both undergraduate and postgraduate level and an emerging profile of continuing professional development and/or scholarship profile. We particularly welcome applicants who work collaboratively and creatively to meet high pedagogical standards in the Department and the School.

PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTABILITIES

- 1. To deliver and contribute to the design of high-quality teaching programmes to attract students.
- 2. To engage in individual and/or collaborative education and scholarship activity to

- inform pedagogy and ensure excellent learning experiences for students.
- 3. To contribute fully to the School and University by participating in meetings, working groups, and committees and other School and University activities.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Teaching & Student Support

- 1.1. Contribute to the planning, delivery and assessment of high-quality undergraduate and postgraduate teaching in the Department of Language Studies (English Language focus), in liaison with the relevant programme and course convenors.
- 1.2. Contribute to the development, design and management of courses and new curriculum proposals that are attractive to students.
- 1.3. Contribute to developing high-quality inclusive teaching materials, methods and approaches using appropriate technology; take responsibility for their quality and ensure that they meet defined learning objectives.
- 1.4. Set, mark, and assess coursework and examinations; select appropriate assessment instruments and assessment criteria; and provide constructive and comprehensive feedback to students.
- 1.5. Ensure that teaching materials remain up-to-date and relevant, incorporating advances in the subject area into the course of study.
- 1.6. Develop and maintain an understanding of appropriate pedagogy in the subject area and respond to challenges.
- 1.7. Supervise the work of foundation year, undergraduate and taught postgraduate students, providing them with advice on study skills.
- 1.8. Undertake and complete administrative duties required in the professional delivery of teaching.
- 1.9. Make a significant contribution to the accreditation of courses and quality-control processes.
- 1.10. Undertake academic advising duties, and provide first-line support for sensitive issues, referring on as appropriate to services providing further assistance.
- 1.11. Adopt an approachable and accessible attitude towards students, offering office hours, informal advice etc.

2. Scholarship & Enterprise

- 2.1. Individually or with colleagues, explore opportunities for enterprise activity, third stream income and/or consultancy.
- 2.2. Build internal contacts and participate in internal networks and relevant external networks to form relationships and collaborations.

- 2.3. Supervise masters and potentially also doctoral students as part of a supervision team, as appropriate to the discipline.
- 2.4. Continually update knowledge and understanding in a field or specialism and engage in continuous professional development.
- 2.5. Translate knowledge of advances in the subject area into the course of study.
- 2.6. Undertake scholarship to inform education to ensure excellent learning experience for students.

- 3. Contribute to the strategic planning and decision-making process to meet the goals and objectives of the DLS and the wider university.
- 4. Collaborate with colleagues to develop and implement student support services, such as tutorials, workshops, and study skills sessions.
- 5. Stay updated with the latest developments within EAP and ELT and related fields through active engagement with scholarship activities within and outside DLS.

- 2. CELTA, Trinity TESOL, or equivalent certification in English language teaching.
- 3. Recent and substantial experience in teaching foundation year, undergraduate and/or postgraduate modules to a range of students.
- 4. Recent and substantial experience in teaching English for Academic Purposes (EAP) in a UK Higher Education context.
- 5. Strong organizational and administrative skills, with the capability to handle multiple tasks and meet deadlines.
- 6. Excellent communication and interpersonal skills, enabling effective collaboration with colleagues, students, and stakeholders.
- 7. Flexibility and adaptability to thrive in a dynamic and changing academic environment.

- 1. PhD (or near completion) in ELT, TESOL, Applied Linguistic or related fields.
- 2. DELTA or equivalent certification in English language teaching.
- 3. Experience in teaching international students, demonstrating a deep understanding of their unique learning needs and cultural backgrounds.
