It is not possible to take autumn only of a full year module or to join a full year module in the spring semester.
- Level 3 = year 0 (sub-degree); Level 4 = year 1; Level 5 = year 2; Level 6 = year 3 (final year)
- You are generally expected to take 60 credits per semester and 120 credits for the full year (minimum of 90 and maximum of 150). A minimum of 45 credits and a maximum of 75 credits may be taken in one semester.
